#### **Town Hall Meeting on Town Square Park** **New Date to Be Announced**

Many Aromas residents showed up in Salinas, on the 10<sup>th</sup> of March before the Monterey County Parks Commission to offer testimony around their vision of our Aromas Town park. Some hoped that this hearing would result in the formation of a 5-member committee

of community members to advise the Commissioners as to Aromas resident's vision of their park.

The Commissioners decided not to form another committee. Instead, they chose to hold a Town Hall meeting at the Aromas Community Grange to discuss the future of the Aromas Town Square Park. The meeting was scheduled for May 26 but has been postponed because the Grand Opening of the new Aromas School Gym is that evening.

The Parks Department would like to see Aromas area residents come together and agree on a plan for the Town Square Park. If you want to be a part of this important decision, don't miss the Town Hall meeting. We will keep you posted when the new date is announced; we want everyone to be there.

## Report on the April 7<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Santa Cruz County Integrated Waste Management Local Task Force

On Thursday, April 7, the Waste Management Task Force met to discuss alternatives to building a new landfill in Santa Cruz County and voted to adopt a Zero Waste Resolution. The Zero Waste Resolution sets a goal of 75% waste reduction by the year 2010 for the County of Santa Cruz, with the ultimate goal of a completely closed recycling system that reuses all resources and generates zero waste in the future.

This could possibly eliminate the need for a landfill site on the Chamberlain Ranch property in the hills overlooking Aromas.

The first action that will be brought before the Santa Cruz Board of Supervisors is the enforcement of all waste reduction and recycling ordinances already on the books. Testing will then be implemented to determine what kinds of solid waste are still ending up in the waste disposal stream so they can develop a plan for reclaiming and recycling them.

We will keep you posted...stay tuned.
